MERS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The CIM Maintenance, Engineering and Reliability Society MERS Memorial Scholarship was created in 2017 and is awarded each year in remembrance of one or more of the Society's individuals who have attracted prominence and recognition for contributions and service to the activities of the CIM MERS Society.

In 2016 the CIM Diversity and Inclusion best practice guidelines articulated the goal that *Diversity* become an ingrained value systemic of the CIM and the mining industry as a whole. Consequently in 2017 the MERS Society decided that MERS Memorial scholarship should be used to strengthen the opportunities for access and inclusion to the industry, via a post-secondary education pathway for awardees, so that diversity within the Canadian mining industry and associated industries is improved.

Access and/or maintenance scholarship for academically

excellent post-secondary students, non-renewable

Value of Scholarship

\$4,000 payable around January / February of the academic

year for which the award is made. In order to receive the

award, the recipient must provide an official

communication from their institution confirming

successful completion of the fall semester.

Eligibility

This scholarship is open to any CIM National member (including student members), or the son, daughter or spouse of a CIM National member, enrolled, full time, at any Canadian post-secondary institution, following a program of relevance to the Canadian mining industry.

Note: CIM National membership is open to students from a very broad range of degree disciplines, including those that extend well beyond science and engineering. Students, and prospective students can join the CIM online at:

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about CIM MERS Scholarships

What is an entrance scholarship? It is a scholarship for a person that has entered, or is entering their first

year of post-secondary education. Do not apply for an entrance scholarship if you are entering, or are in, the second or subsequent year

of your post-secondary education

What are the MERS disciplines? The MERS disciplines constitute engineering or technologist level

studies in Mechanical, Civil, Electrical, Electronics, Instrumentation, Chemical, Computer Sciences, Material Sciences, Manufacturing and related disciplines. If you are studying Mining Engineering, you may

wish to consider applying to one of the other scholarships instead.

I am a post-graduate student. Can I apply? Yes. The Edward Melville (Ed) Patton scholarship will accept your

application as a graduate student, however this award is not only for graduate students. Students doing an undergraduate project can apply

too.

What if I am not current a CIM Member? If you are not currently a CIM member, you can still apply for a

scholarship if one of your parents, or your spouse is a CIM National member already. I am currently on a co-op. Can I apply? In order to be eligible for a CIM MERS scholarship you must be


registered as a full-time student. Co-op placements that are an official / formal part of a degree program normally require registration with your post-secondary institution as if you were going to be present for taught

classes.

What is a post-secondary institution? In Canada, a post-secondary institution refers to an educational

institution that provides education beyond high school (secondary school). These institutions offer a range of programs leading to degrees, diplomas, and certificates. 'Post-secondary institution' does not just

mean 'University', means Colleges and Trade Schools too.





Required Application Information

- Applicant's name, address, telephone number and email address
- CIM membership number or parent's or spouse's membership number
- Proof of enrolment at a post-secondary institution in Canada
- Transcript of marks from post-secondary institution, or if at the stage of having just entered a post-secondary institution, transcript of secondary education marks
- Personal statement detailing how and why you have decided to follow your post-secondary program and how the scholarship, if awarded, will assist you in developing your career within the Canadian mining industry and/or related industries. (max. 2 pages)
- In your application please clearly respond to the following question: "If the MERS Memorial Scholarship is awarded to you, how will this help the CIM achieving its Diversity and Inclusion objectives?" (max. ½ page)

After completing the form on the following pages, please save them (only) as a pdf file. Compile all required annexes, including scanned documents, as pdf files.

Then, combine all the pdf files into a single pdf file, ensuring the application comes first and name the compiled file according to the following format:

YYYY_MERS_Memorial_YourSurname_YourFirstNames.pdf.

For example, if Wayne Gretzky was making an application in October 2025, then the file would have been named:

2025_MERS_Memorial_Gretzky_Wayne.pdf

The size of the compiled pdf file should not exceed 5MB.

Then, submit your application to the following email address: MER Scholarships@cim.org

with the text:

in the subject line of the email.

Do this before:

23:59 Eastern Standard Time on 31st October of the current academic year.

If you are selected for an award, you will be contacted by our scholarships coordinator who will ask you to confirm your post-secondary registration status and for additional personal details, such as a head and shoulders photograph for award announcement purposes, a void cheque so you can be paid and your Social Insurance Number so that we can inform the Canada Revenue Agency of your award.
